W: As you get older, keeping your mind sharp and active becomes one of the key concerns to living a healthy life. Small changes in your daily life will bring you great benefits.

First, work out regularly. Research shows that as little as 10 minutes of exercise will be enough for our body to release endorphins, which improves our awareness. That is, walking up and down the stairs for a few minutes will be enough to keep your mind active.

Plus, mental exercise is considered helpful and thus recommended. Mental exercise is the act of performing mentally-difficult tasks. Here are some mental exercises you can try on your own every day. Just play one or two crossword puzzles a day. Playing chess with friends can also work. Attempting to memorize a grocery list before going to the store is also a good one. You can also try using the non-dominant hand for tasks such as using chopsticks or brushing teeth.
